Day 1: Buenos Aires – The Gateway to Your Antarctic Adventure

Don't miss the opportunity to savour a meal at one of the city's renowned parrillas, where you can indulge in succulent Argentine steak, grilled to perfection.

The city is the birthplace of this passionate dance, and there are numerous venues offering tango shows and lessons. After a comprehensive briefing from the Expedition Team, take some time to settle into your cabin and familiarize yourself with the ship's amenities. This is your home for the next leg of your journey, and it is equipped with all the comforts you need for a seamless expedition experience. Spend the rest of the day exploring the ship, meeting fellow travellers, and preparing for the remarkable adventure that lies ahead.

Days 3-4: Drake Passage – Preparing for Antarctica

Visit the onboard Science Centre, where interactive exhibits and expert presentations provide valuable insights into the icy continent. Engage in discussions on Antarctic wildlife, the science beneath the ice, and how to minimize your impact during your visit. The Team will also introduce you to various Citizen Science projects you can participate in, contributing to ongoing research and conservation efforts.

In between educational sessions, enjoy the relaxation and amenities aboard your ship. Unwind in the spa and wellness area, savour exquisite meals in the dining room, and socialize with other passengers in the Explorer Lounge & Bar. The crossing offers a chance to both prepare for and reflect on the extraordinary journey ahead.

Days 5-15: Antarctica – Immersed in the Frozen Continent

Observe large penguin colonies huddling on ice floes, majestic whales gliding through icy waters in search of krill, and a diverse array of seabirds soaring overhead.

Your expedition will take you to various landing sites, where you'll have the opportunity to disembark and explore on foot and embark on ice-cruises to get up close to the stunning ice formations. Depending on conditions, you may even have the chance to kayak among the icebergs, offering a unique and intimate perspective of this frozen world.

Throughout the journey, the Expedition Team will continue to provide lectures and insights, deepening your understanding of Antarctica's natural environment and ongoing conservation challenges. The captain will adjust the itinerary as needed to ensure the best possible experience, adapting to weather and ice conditions.
